Elks Most Valuable Student Scholarship (Apply Online)



Each year, the Elks National Foundation awards over \$2 million in Most Valuable Student scholarships to 500 high school seniors nationwide. Applications will be judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need. Apply online at enf.elks.org/mvs by November 5, 2019.

University of Southern Indiana B/MD Scholarship (Additional Information and Application)

The purpose of the B/MD program at USI is to increase the number of physicians providing medical services to residents of southwestern and southern Indiana and to increase opportunities for residents in the

southwestern and southern portions of Indiana, to obtain education and training at the Indiana University School of Medicine. Students eligible to apply must have an SAT score of 1280 on a single test or an ACT composite of 27 and a cumulative high school GPA of at least a 3.5/4.0. The application deadline is December 1.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Students may apply for the FAFSA from October 1, 2019, through April 15, 2020, for grants and loans to attend college beginning in the fall of 2020. Students and parents will sign in using a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID).

Ivy Tech will be hosting FAFSA sessions on November 3 and February 23 at 2:00 p.m.

SELECTING AND APPLYING TO COLLEGE

Parchment Accounts

All seniors must create a <u>Parchment</u> account to request transcripts be sent to the college(s) of their choice. Click <u>here</u> to view a video tutorial on ordering your official transcript.

Questions to Consider When Choosing a College

- What are class sizes?
- Is there a freshman orientation or transition to college program?
- What is the graduation rate?
- What percentage of students graduate in two/four years, depending on the program?
- What kind of student activities or organizations are on campus?
- What do students like best about this college?
- What academic or other support is offered such as free tutoring, a writing lab, counseling
- Other factors: small campus, large university, community college, living at home

Use the "My College Choice" worksheet to compare colleges/universities you are considering.

College Visits

Seniors have two days to visit college campuses. The deadline for approved MVHS college visits is May 1. Students need to pick up a <u>college visit form</u> from Mrs. Martin in the guidance office and follow the guidelines regarding attendance.

College Cost Calculators

Each college and university in the United States is required to have an updated college cost calculator, which indicates accurate current prices and fees for colleges. Use this tool to determine the cost of the schools you are considering. Many use the <u>college cost calculator</u> supplied by the College Board.

THE COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS

- 1. Submit online or paper application to the college/university.
- 2. Request a transcript be sent to the college/university using your <u>Parchment</u> account. (See instructions to the left.)
- 3. Request that ACT and/or SAT scores be sent to the college/university when registering for the exam.
- 4. Things to have on hand when you apply:
 - GPA and class rank
 - SAT/ACT scores
 - Social Security Number
 - Email address
 - Parents' information (workplace, address, phone, etc.)
 - Dual credit (CAP) information (course number and dates enrolled)
 - AP course information, if applicable
 - Graduation date (May 22, 2020)
 - Counselor's email address:

NCAA CLEARINGHOUSE

The NCAA has implemented <u>online registration</u> for those students wanting to play Division I or Division II athletics in college. Use your <u>Parchment</u> account to request that your transcript be sent to the NCAA. The cost is \$90 (waivers are available for those who qualify). You must have your SAT/ACT scores sent directly from ACT or the College Board to the clearinghouse if you are going to play Division I or Division II athletics. Academic requirements include the following:

- Complete 16 core courses, including 10 before your senior year
- Minimum GPA in core courses must be a 2.3
- Seven of ten core courses must be in English, math, and science.

SAT AND ACT TESTS

These exams are designed to assess what you learned in high school and what you need to be successful in college. When deciding which test to take, be sure to check with the college/university you are planning to attend to see which test is required or recommended. Many colleges/universities will accept both the SAT and ACT. Be sure when you register for the SAT or ACT that you indicate the colleges/universities to which you would like for your scores to be sent.

The SAT and ACT are both given at MVHS (See dates to the right). Both exams can also be taken in Evansville on additional dates. On test day you must bring your calculator, admission ticket, and picture ID.

SAT Features

- Top score is 1600
- Four sections: reading, writing and language, math, and essay (optional)
- Total time: 3 hours (3 hours 50 minutes with essay)
- No penalty for wrong answers

Free SAT practice tests and other tools are available at the <u>Khan Academy</u> web site.

ACT Features

- Top score is 36
- Five sections: English, math, reading, science, and essay (optional)
- Total time: 2 hours 55 minutes (3 hours 35 minutes with essay)
- No penalty for guessing
- Has an interest inventory that allows students to evaluate their interests and career options


