2023 Frye-Love Education Profession Scholarship Information

General Information

This is a \$500 merit scholarship to be awarded to a graduating student of Mt. Vernon Senior High School who enters the teaching profession or a related educational field.

Eligibility

- A. Have attended Mt. Vernon Senior High School for at least two (2) years.
- B. Must have at least a 3.25 cumulative grade point average.
- C. Be in his/her senior year and expect to graduate from Mt. Vernon Senior High School at the end of the academic year in which the award is made.
- D. Intend to enroll at an accredited four-year college or university in the United States no later than September 30 of the year in which the award is made to pursue a degree in teaching or a related educational field.
- E. Have shown significant leadership and service oriented roles.
- F. Have consistently demonstrated the personal qualities of initiative, perseverance, leadership, and determination in the pursuit of his/her secondary education.

Selection Criteria

- 1. Scholarship Achievement (20 points maximum)
 - a. Strength of high school program, considering credits earned and subject difficulty.
 - b. Grade point average (minimum 3.25 cumulative).
- 2. Leadership and Service Achievement (30 points maximum for each category)
 - a. List of school, church, and community activities supplied by applicant.
- 3. Potential, Aspirations, and Motivation as Evidenced in Essay and Future Plans (20 points maximum)

Payment
